# What are Local Road Safety Plans?



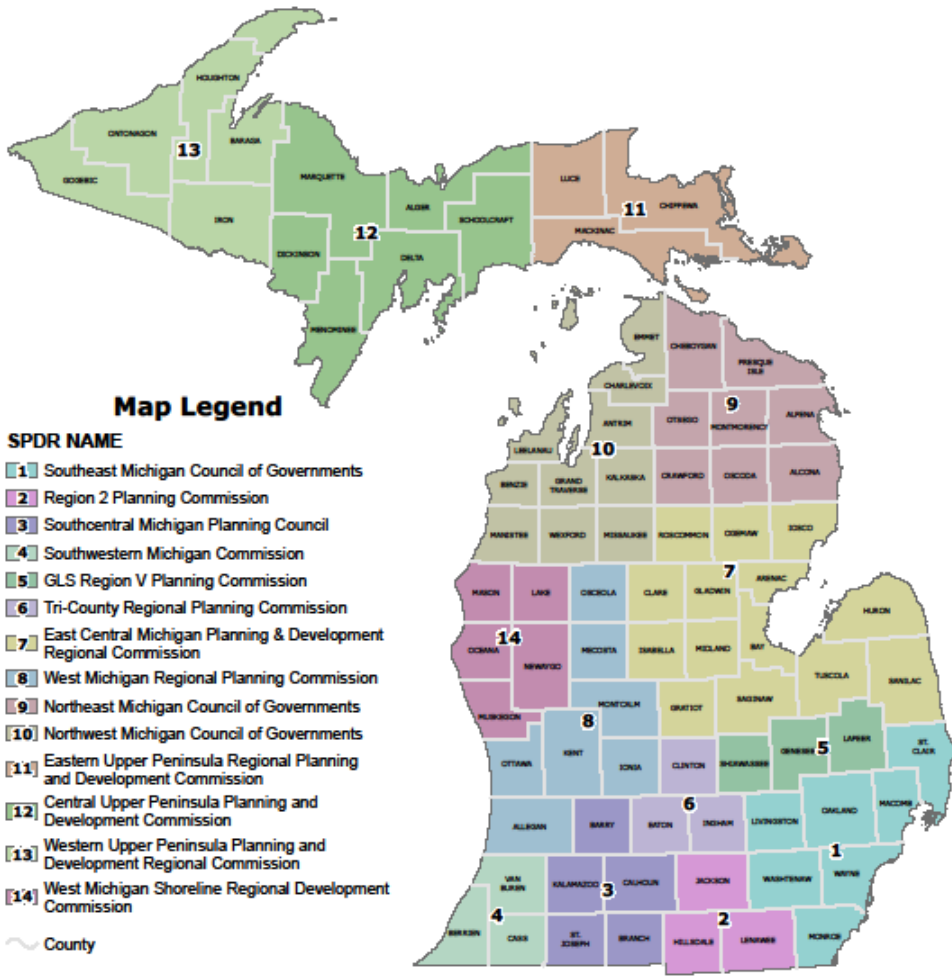
A Local Road Safety Plan (LRSP) is a formal document that defines key emphasis areas and strategies that impact local roads and provides a framework to accomplish safety enhancements at the local level. They can be used to identify key safety needs and guide investment decisions to achieve reductions in fatalities and serious injuries on local public roadways. A LRSP provides an excellent opportunity for safety stakeholders and involved agencies at all levels of government (local, State, and Federal) to work together to align and leverage resources to address the safety challenges and assist in moving Michigan Toward Zero Deaths.



# Local Road Safety Plans

- How are Local Road Safety Plans tied in with your State's Strategic Highway Safety Plan?
  - Crash data.
  - Same principles/methods used in development of LRSP as in the latest update of our SHSP.
- What portion of HSIP funds go to local projects?
  - Roughly \$15 million to local projects.
  - \$3.5 million to local railroad projects.

# Steps for LRSP

- Establish Leadership
  - Identify Champion, Convene Working Group, Identify & Contact Stakeholders, Program Coordination & Sustainability, Develop Vision, Mission Statement & Goals
- Analyze Safety Data
  - Gather Data, Data Analysis w/Crash Data, Data Analysis w/ other Safety Data
- Determine Emphasis Areas
  - Identify Emphasis Area Objectives & Performance Measures, Emphasis Area Examples
- Identify Strategies
  - Categorize & Review, Propose Ordinances & Policies
- Prioritize and Incorporate Strategies
  - Identify Priorities, Determine Intended Implementation Approach for Strategies, Draft the Plan
- Evaluate and Update the LRSP
  - Monitor Progress, Plan Evaluation, Living Document

- Invite participants
  - Assist in identifying local champion
  - Identifying local data
  - Meeting future Performance Measures
  - Coordinate meetings
    - Location, date, time
