

23 CFR 450.324(I) (1) Development and Content of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

As a management tool for monitoring progress in implementing the transportation plan, the TIP should identify the criteria and process for prioritizing the implementation of transportation plan elements (including multimodal trade-offs) for inclusion in the TIP and any changes in priorities from previous TIPs.

What are Project Prioritization Procedures?

- Project prioritization procedures mean the cooperative procedures followed by MPOs, the State, and public transportation operators to select projects for inclusion in the TIP.
- These procedures have the potential to significantly streamline the project selection process when additional revenue has been identified.
- This tool helps to determine the best mix of projects for the region to help with the goals and objective outlined in the MTP.

What will FHWA be looking for in the TIP?

- The process used for selecting the projects for inclusion in the TIP has been documented.
- If the process used by the MPO is not documented, we will provide comments and work with you to make the appropriate changes to the document.
